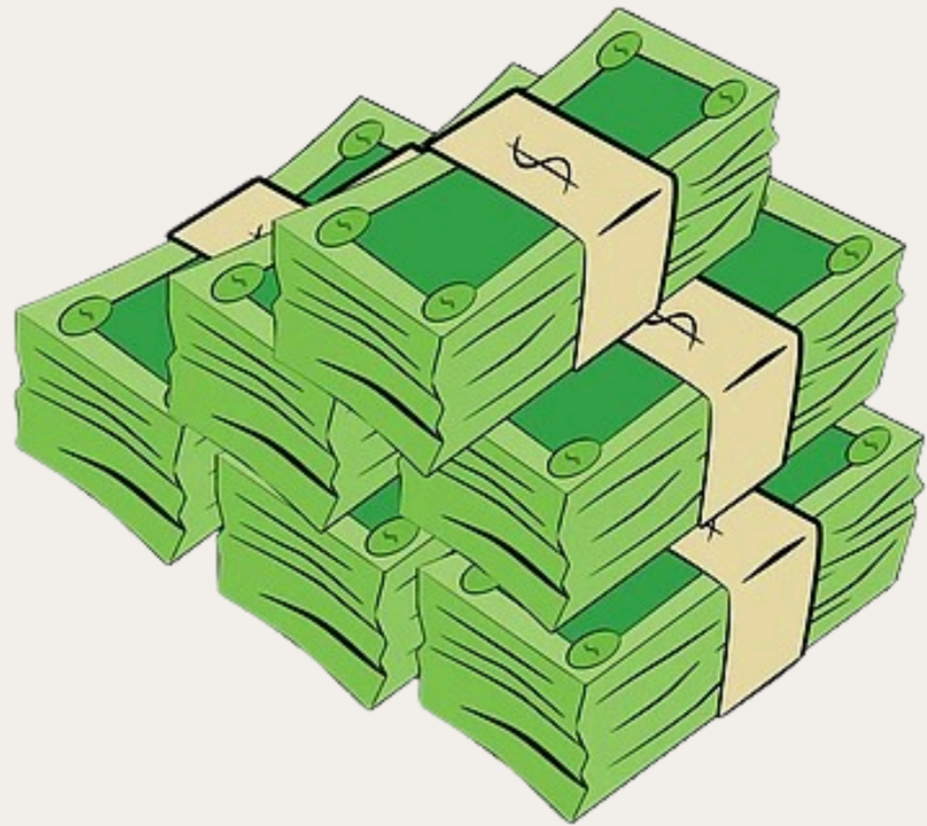
Benefits speak the truth?

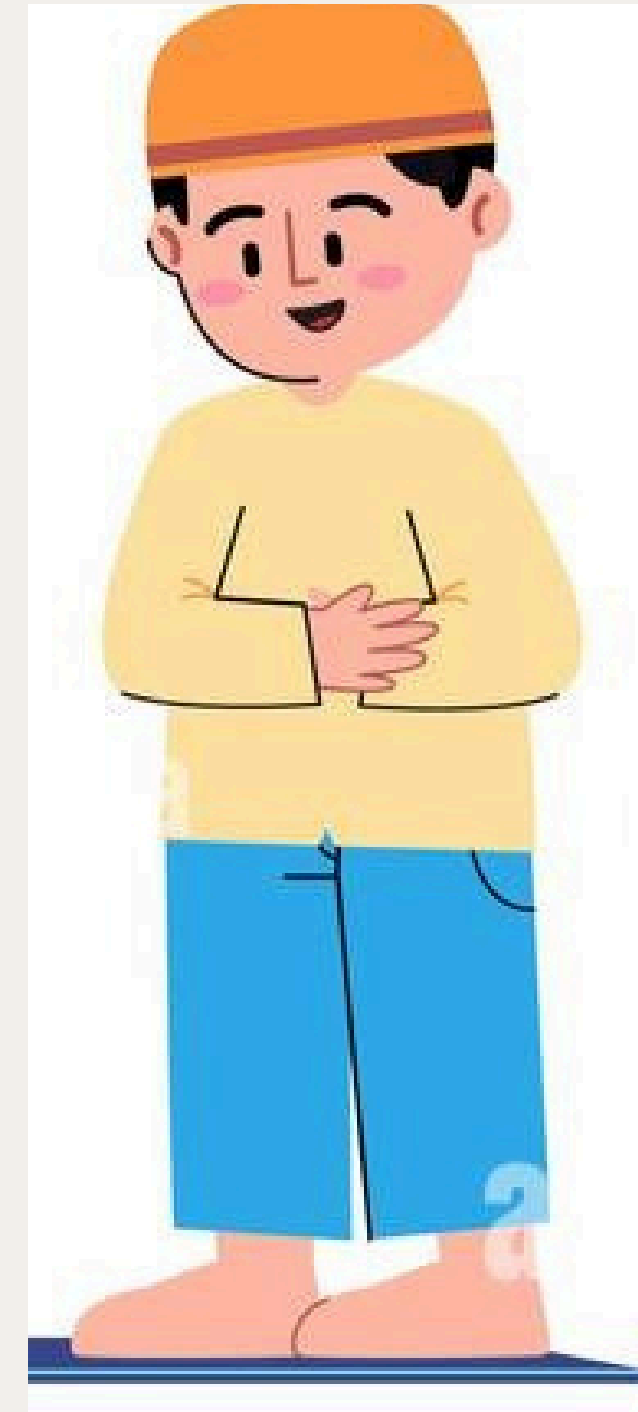
